To draw lines of different sizes/thickness and colour using a variety of tools.

COLLAGE

To sort, arrange and mix materials to create texture in collage.
The Crow's Tail story.

DRAWING

To draw lines of different sizes/thickness and colour using a variety of tools.
Spirals theme.

TEXTILES

To investigate weaving and embellishing fabric Group and Class collaborative project.

PAINTING

To use thick and thin brushes and mix primary colours to make secondary colours.
Applying techniques to own creations.

PRINTMAKING

To explore printmaking with a variety of surfaces. Plasticine printing, investigating objects and how marks can be made.

PRINTING

To use a variety of objects and techniques to create prints. Positive and negative stencils. Castles texture and design.

TEXTILES

To use dip-dye and printing relief blocks on textiles.
Lancelot Ribeirobuilding a city landscape selecting colours and printing onto fabric.

To use cut and torn paper to produce an image and to understand the term 'complementary' colours.

DRAWING

To investigate a range of different mark makers in response to descriptive vocabulary and music.

To use techniques such as rolling, cutting, moulding to create 3D art.

Examples of Year 2 work:

















PAINTING

To mix colours (tints, shades, primary and secondary) effectively to create mood. To experiment with the techniques of 'tonking' lay newspaper over damp paint and gently peel to remove some of the paint and leave some of the print and 'saraffito' moist paint is scratched away to reveal the surface beneath.

COLLAGE

To mix primary colours to make complementary colours and transpose ideas from painting to collage looking at the positive and negative images created.

PRINTING

To use a roller and experiment with monoprints.

Use a variety of textures, colours and surfaces to investigate techniques.

3D

To use different sources to inspire and develop my ideas, collecting ideas in my sketch books I can use a pattern to plan my designs Stone age art

3D Create a decorated clay or gummed tape tile or dish.

DRAWING

To explore shading techniques (e.g. hatching and cross hatching) to show tone and texture.

TEXTILES

To explore pattern, dip-dye fabric and design print focus on seascape/ sea creatures. Create collagraph print to make final piece.

DRAWING

To focus in on an image concentrating on lines, shapes and proportions using a range of pencils: HB, 2B and 6B.

Greek Art – pattern and form.

TEXTILES

To develop dip dye resist techniques and develop knotting, threading and binding techniques. Investigate Annie Albers, German artist inspired by Peru. Create a weaving loom to express your ideas.

PRINTING

To investigate monoprinting – an image created on a smooth surface and a print taken. collagraph printing – a collage of textured materials glued to a printing plate.

3D

Use solid materials to create and combine shapes to create recognisable forms. Rolling, shaping, coiling.

PAINTING

To choose the appropriate brush, and use a number of brush techniques including a background wash to produce shape, texture, pattern and lines using water colours. Georgia O'Keefe, Claude Monet.

COLLAGE

To select effective materials and use these overlapping, mosaic and montage. (To take inspiration from the greats. To respond to the work of Henri Matisse. Andy Warhol Pop Art.


