THIS IS THE FRONT OF THE SCHOOL



THIS IS THE CAR PARK

There is a pit where the cars are piled and the bricks have fallen. These were caused by a bomb and the cars have been ruined by fire damage. Aren't we lucky that our school community can get to school safely?





THIS IS THE OUTSIDE WALL

Their school walls have been attacked with gun fire and shrapnel and the windows are replaced with bin bags. Aren't we lucky to have beautiful school grounds?





THESE ARE FLOOR PAINTINGS

Their playground floor has been ruined by bombs. Aren't we lucky to have beautiful playground markings and a safe place to play?







THIS IS A CLASSROOM

Their classroom has fire damage and there are no resources left. Aren't we lucky that we have bright and colourful classrooms and books to use and read?







THIS IS THEIR CLIMBING FRAME

Their play area and climbing frames are empty as it is not safe for the children to return to school. Aren't we lucky that we have a school full of friends to play with in a safe environment?





THIS IS THE CORRIDOR

Their corridors are empty and burnt. Aren't we lucky to have spacious corridors with beautiful displays?





THESE ARE THEIR RESOURCES

All of their work has been destroyed and their equipment has been ruined. Aren't we lucky that we have books to work in and things to use.
