Key Indicator 1: Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity	Lunch Clubs delivered by GVTSSP provided each year group with the opportunity to be part of a group activity. During sessions the coach was able to direct and guide pupils on how they could improve their game or skills. Due to the experience of the coach they were able to adapt sessions to meet the needs of individuals.	£25x2x38=£1,900

	The free after school clubs were well attended. The school ensured that all year groups had the opportunity to sign up for two of the clubs during the year. 	Year 6 Ambassadors did a fantastic job of leading the school in sporting activities during lunchtimes. Information was shared during assembly; competitions were shared and celebrated. 	Sports Ambassadors and School Council were asked what additional equipment would benefit the pupils and why. Purchased an outdoor activity bag which had a variety of equipment for children to use. Each year group was given a day when they could use the bag. Resulted in leadership skills being developed and perseverance and competitiveness for the pupils.	£250 Equipment

Key Indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school	- Sports Ambassadors did an amazing job. Time dedicated for the Year 6 Ambassadors to meet Subject Lead and PE coach ensured that the profile of PE was a focus for the year. - Purchase of sportswear for staff to show pupils the importance of dressing appropriately for safety and comfort. - As a school we attended several competitions and experienced a degree of success in many of the competitions. The school came first in Tennis U11 and in Lower Key Stage 2 Multi-sports Festival. Celebrated success in assemblies, newsletter and Class Dojo – raising the profile. Some of these competitions required transport to attend as they were organised during the school day. - This year we returned to a whole school Sports Day which was very well attended. The event included a range of traditional events and some competitiveness races. Families were invited to stay for a picnic afterwards. Our sports coach had time allowed to plan and work with subject lead. - In Assembly, time dedicated to Sports Ambassadors and Running Club to celebrate success. - Parents and staff have the opportunity to share with the school community when children have been bold adventurers.
